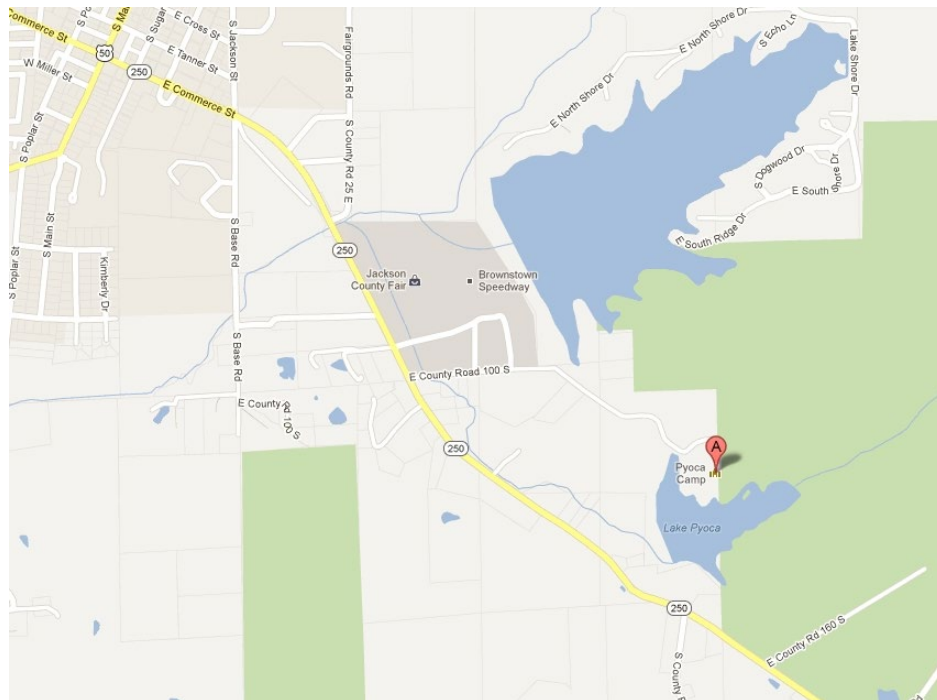
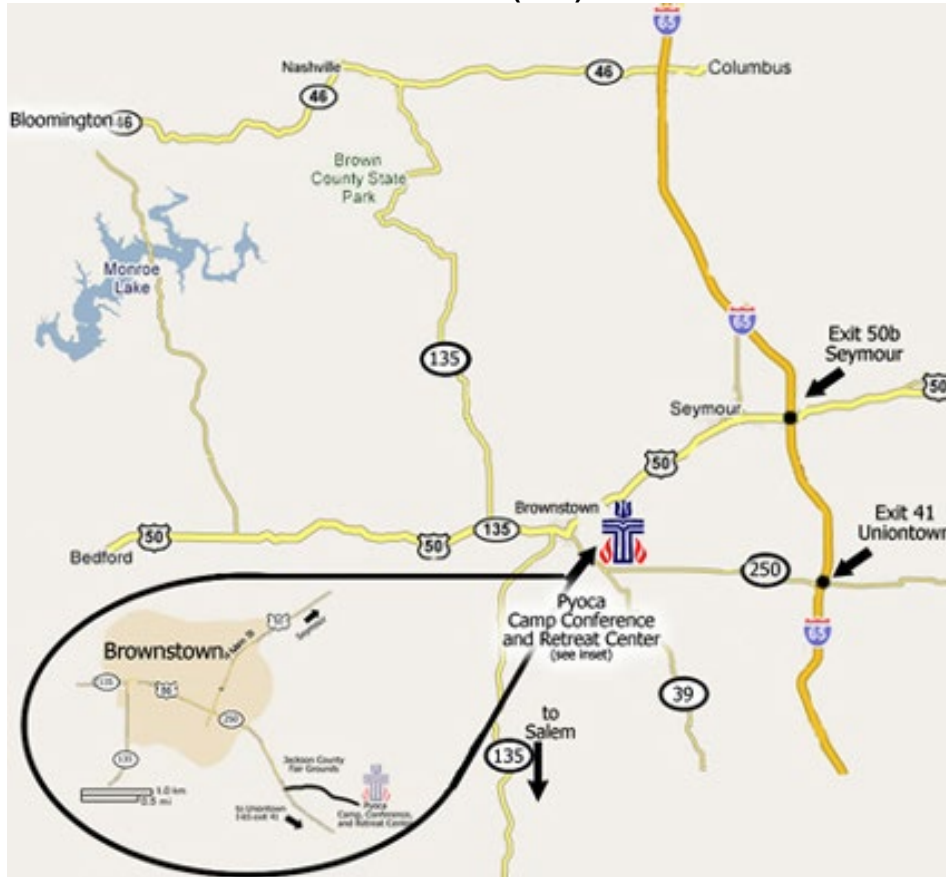

**Pyoca is located in Brownstown, Indiana, approximately 15 miles west of Seymour, IN.**

**Construction Note: Between Highway 50 (Seymour) and the Ohio River, I-65 will have periodic lane restrictions/closures in both directions.**

**For those traveling on I-65:**

- Take US 50 exit west at Seymour.
- Travel west approximately 15 miles on US 50 to Brownstown and turn left (south) on 250.
- Go one mile, and then turn left at the Pyoca sign, immediately past the Jackson County Fairgrounds.
- Continue to follow the drive until you come to the main lodge.

**For those traveling east on U.S. 50:**

- Upon entering Brownstown, go straight at the red light (where U.S. 50 turns left) You will now be on 250.
- Continue for one mile, and then turn left at the Pyoca sign, immediately past the Jackson County Fairgrounds.
- Continue to follow the drive until you come to the main lodge.

## FOR ACTION

2. That, if the way be clear following his examination, Sung Soo Hong be ordained to the Ordered Ministry of the Word and Sacrament at this Assembly.

**Faith Journey Statement**  
Sung Soo Hong

I was raised in a Christian family in South Korea. My brother is an ordained pastor in a Korean Presbyterian church. I have been very active in the church. When I was in middle school, I was a worship leader, a choir member, and the president of the youth group. I never missed worship services, church events, retreats, and revival meetings. When I was in college, I joined Campus Crusade for Christ and participated eagerly in its campus worship services, district services, overnight prayers, and more.

Since I enjoyed reading books and studied philosophy and psychology in college, I had many questions about God and the Bible. But neither church education nor the campus ministry was able to give satisfactory answers. When answering questions during bible studies, my pastor used to say, "Our teacher Calvin said..." I wanted to know what the Bible says, not what Calvin said about the Bible. I also had a growing desire to be able to read the Bible in its original languages.

I then learned of the Korea Institute for Advanced Theological Studies in Seoul, Korea. There I took many courses and attended special lectures on church history, theology, and biblical studies for about two years. Learning from and talking with scholar-pastors at the institute, I decided to pursue graduate study in the US.

I am grateful that I did my MDiv at Drew Theological School, a community that seeks justice, promotes rigorous learning, and celebrates diversity. I was greatly inspired by the bible professors there. After completing the MDiv program, I further pursued biblical studies at Yale Divinity School (MA) and at the University of Texas at Austin (PhD in NT, Christian Origins, and Early Christianity). I wrote my dissertation on the Letter of James, one of my favorite books.

During the discernment process for the past several months, many people asked me about my sense of call. I think, for some people, myself included, call is something you realize in retrospect as you connect dots. What I know now is that I am where I am, and I am doing what I am doing thanks to the many people I have met along the way, from whom I've learned things and who have given me valuable opportunities. At the same time, I believe there is one and the same call for all Christians-the call to follow Jesus, who came to bring the good news to the poor and set free those who are oppressed (Luke 4:18-19).

**Statement of Faith**  
Sung Soo Hong

I believe in

God who created the world,  
created humanity in God's image,  
made a covenant with Abraham through which all nations are blessed,  
and reems creation with grace and justice;

Jesus the Son of God

who emptying himself came to us  
proclaiming good news to the poor, setting  
free the oppressed,  
healing the brokenhearted,  
and eating with the marginalized,  
who suffered, died for our sins, and rose up,  
who calls us to follow him with our own cross,  
and who will come to judge the world;

the Holy Spirit

who inspired the prophets,  
descended upon Jesus,  
has empowered and interceded for the followers of Jesus, who  
works through the sacraments,  
and who calls the people of God without discrimination to ministries of the church.

I also believe

that the Bible is the Word of God that should be interpreted accurately and ethically  
responsible ways, and applied to our lives,  
that the church must worship God and proclaim the good news in the world,  
seeking justice and peace,  
encouraging its members to love one another,  
and taking care of people in need,  
that there is one baptism that signifies our repentance, new life, and the unity of the church,  
that the Lord's Supper not only reminds us of Christ's death for us but also requires us to  
proclaim the good news and to take care of our sisters and brothers in need,  
and that the reign of God is present among the followers of Jesus and is coming.
